Furthermore, I am very familiar with supporting children with medical needs and disabilities as I worked for over a decade as a hospital teacher specialising in neuro-rehabilitation and other complex needs. Indeed, I first trained to be a SENCo in 2007 when I was working as a hospital teacher and was given the responsibility of managing SEN and Disability (SEND) provision across several sites. This in turn led to a commitment to life-long learning and enabled me to obtain a PhD in pastoral pedagogy (2014) by proving the ability for everyone to achieve their full potential regardless of circumstances if we nurture their minds, body and spirit.

Not surprisingly, I welcome this opportunity, as a member of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT), to contribute to the development of The Orchards Primary Academy as a first-class provider that puts the needs and well-being of every pupil, in partnership with their parents / carers, at the heart of its educational practice and vision.
