Hope you are all well. I really hope you enjoyed last week's story. This week's story is again one of my favourite stories. Please enjoy the activities using the story 'Goldilocks and The Three Bears'. Remember to put pictures of children's work on our school Facebook page. All worksheets and additional work can be found on DB Primary and the school website. Also I would like you to start writing sentences as much as possible. I will put extra writing practise on DB Primary. Please remember to use the Reception Expectations that were on Db Primary the other week to ensure that your child has achieved as much as possible before they start year1. Keep safe and hopefully see you all soon.

Literacy

1. Watch the story of Goldilocks and The Three Bears on You Tube or share the book with an adult.
2. Complete the speech bubbles writing what the characters might say.
3. Write the story in your own words. Read your story to a grown up.
4. Discuss with an adult what you liked and did not like about the story.
5. Discuss with an adult whether Goldilocks was right going in somebody else's home.
6. Follow the instructions found on DB Primary and make your own porridge.
7. Write sentences using the sheets found on Db Primary

Mathematics

1. Roll a dice two times. Add the two lots of dots together and record your number sentence. Eg $3+2=5$
2. Weigh out the ingredients when you make porridge.
3. Write numbers 1-20. Ask an adult to ask you what one more/less than a number is.
4. Fill up different containers and say how much liquid it has in. Vocabulary you could use could be full, empty, nearly full, half full etc.
5. Use a ruler to measure objects in your home. Record your findings. Discuss which was the longest and shortest objects.
6. Count up to 20 or beyond.
7. Add two numbers together to find a total.
8. Make a shape picture and say the shape names and describe the characters.
9. Learn your double to 20
10. Learn your number bonds to 10

Expressive arts and Design/ Understanding the world

1. Paint a picture from the story.
2. Make a collage using different materials from your home.
3. Do rubbing of things found outside. This could include leaves, bricks, stones.
4. Use bricks and other construction that you have and make a home that Goldilocks could live in.
5. Draw your home and compare the home that The Three Bear lived in. Think of words to describe both homes.
